First, Mrs Ling explained about the education and culture in China-that elders were respected and the young were cared for, that many skyscrapers dotted the skyline of Beijing and that children loved KFC and McDonalds!

Soon after, Mrs Ling taught us about the schools in China! She showed us a timetable of a typical school day. School started at eight, followed by 40 minute period, then an *eye massage?*! We all thought-"*What is an eye massage and how do you even do it?!!*" We discovered that an Eye Massage was to protect the eye and keep it safe. She also told us that this exercise was performed two times a day by students.

She taught us two Chinese songs (It took a couple of run-throughs to perfect the pronunciation of the words!) and Tai-Chi. Tai Chi is a Martial Art display, but instead of self-defence, in China it is often an exercise for the elderly. We were equipped with red fans.

After Tai-Chi, Mr Yui taught us Chinese calligraphy - very hard when you haven't got the hang of it! We painted the numbers:1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12, which are mainly a collection of lines in Chinese.

On the 8th of March the KS2 school councillors visited the Houses of Parliament. To get there we had to be at Chelmsford train station by 8:15 with Mrs Waring, Mrs Armstrong and Mrs Parkington. We went on the train to Liverpool Street and the underground to Westminster. Upon our arrival, we were met by the amazing sight of Big Ben and the Houses of Parliament - Westminster Palace itself!

We had to walk past all the police with their pistols and machine guns, guarding entrances and exits which made us very nervous!

After we sauntered through a garden with an interesting, colourful pagoda, the Council came face to face with a rather modern building which stood out from the ancient surroundings of Parliament- the Education Centre! For a couple of minutes before entering, we were firmly told *not* to touch the keypads on the wall. As tempting as it was, we followed orders.

When we finally entered, we had to pass through a security check. This was similar to an airport's bag check and a walk-through body scan. We were given a visitor's pass which had to be worn around the neck and the tour was led by a woman (called Diane) to a room which had a screen on all four walls.

Then we looked at a picture of the House of Commons, full of green seats. We learnt about the history of Westminster Palace, *and then* we could explore the grand Houses of Parliament. First we entered the Queen's robing room; it was very regal with red carpet everywhere. Strangely there was a copy of the Magna Carta! Afterwards, we were allowed into the House of Lords. In there, we saw the Queen's meeting chair which was coated in gold leaf! We were not '<u>worthy</u>' to sit down upon the red leather benches!

We all wanted to see the House of Commons but at that particular moment sniffer dogs were checking to see if anyone had planted a bomb. After that, there was a government meeting regarding Justice. We were then informed that there was shortly going to be a Procession of the Speaker. The Speaker is the person who says-"ORDER, ORDER!"

The procession was very smart and serious. The Speaker gave us a little smile and wave - we were very chuffed at that. Diane showed us the oldest part of Parliament - Westminster Hall. Many important people have stood on the steps there and made a speech.

We asked him our assortment of VITAL questions, generated by all the classes at Danbury Park. He was a very busy man that gave his time generously. The School Council walked to the gates protecting 10 Downing Street and had a quick look unfortunately we did not see David Cameron. We continued on our journey, passing the Royal Cavalry, on to Trafalgar Square, overlooked by Nelson's Column. Finally, reaching the underground, we took the tube back to Liverpool Street where we caught the train back to Chelmsford.


