## Curriculum and Pupil Related – Chair, Erica Quirk

The Curriculum Committee met in September. Highlights are captured below.

The End of Year assessment results (summer 2024) were reviewed, and Governors congratulated Year 6 on their achievements and thanked all staff for the continued commitment and hard work.

- · Reading, Writing and Maths remain priorities of this year's School Improvement Plan. The School continues to follow and develop the approach to Writing adopted last year and it was noted that this approach was endorsed by the lead OFSTED inspector. In addition, a whole school focus on Oracy continues to be developed.
- · Governor visits have been made to school to monitor the provision of English and Maths as well as to discuss pupil wellbeing.
- · The Committee was pleased to learn that the Year 6 residential trip has been planned for the summer term.
